Spring Curriculum Newsletter Year 1



Geography

Bright Lights Big City

This main driver project teaches children about the physical and human characteristics of the United Kingdom, including a detailed exploration of the characteristics and features of the capital city, London. They will also learn about The Great Fire of London and its effects.

Design Technology

Taxi!

This project teaches children about wheels, axles and chassis and how they work together to make a vehicle move.

Art and Design

Rain and Sunrays

This project teaches children about collagraph printing, including how to develop a motif to make single and repeated prints.

Science

Seasonal Changes

This project teaches children about the seasons, seasonal changes and typical seasonal weather and events. They learn about measuring the weather and the role of a meteorologist. Children begin to learn about the science of day and night and recognise that the seasons have varying day lengths in the UK.

Religious Education

We will be looking the topic of 'How and why do we celebrate special and sacred times?'

Computing

We will be looking at 'Programming A Moving a Robot' and 'Data Information/Grouping Data'

Citizenship

We will be looking at and discussing rules and why they are necessary and how we can act positively as citizens and economic well-being.

Music

We will be following the Charanga Music Scheme and looking at Blues Music as part of the 'In The Groove' topic and Latin Bossa Nova as part of the 'Round and Round' topic!

<u>PE</u>

Every Monday and Tuesday. This term our topics will be 'throwing and catching' and a dance unit based on the seasons.

English

We will continue following The Write Stuff covering The Queen's Hat (a narrative) and 'Seasons' (a non-fiction text)

Maths

We will continue to follow White Rose Maths - Place Value within 20. Addition and Subtraction within 20. Place Value within 50. Length and Height. Mass and Volume.
